Residents over 60 can register for Covid-19 vaccine at public libraries

Acting Knysna Municipal Manager Dawid Adonis announced that local library services will assist residents aged 60 and above to register to receive the Covid-19 vaccine.

“We are aware that many of our senior residents may have difficulty in registering for any number of reasons,” said Adonis. “Those who require assistance to register for this lifesaving vaccine may visit any of our local libraries. The process does not take much time and residents only need to bring their ID documents along.”

Registration at libraries will begin from 20 May 2021 and takes place between 10h00 and 16h00. Other ways in which to register include:

- Dial *134*832# from any SA network for free
- WhatsApp the word REGISTER to 0600 123456

“Please remember to observe all COVID-19 prevention protocols when visiting our libraries,” Adonis continued. “And remember, even if you have received the vaccine, you still need to wash your hands regularly, avoid crowded spaces and maintain social distancing.”

“We have always been committed to curbing the spread of this virus within our community,” he concluded. “We urge all qualifying residents to register for this phase of the vaccine rollout. And we ask that all residents who need help to do so, make use of this service. Together we can flatten the curve. Together we can fight against the third wave of this destructive pandemic. Together we can create an inclusive, innovative, inspired – and inoculated – Knysna.”
