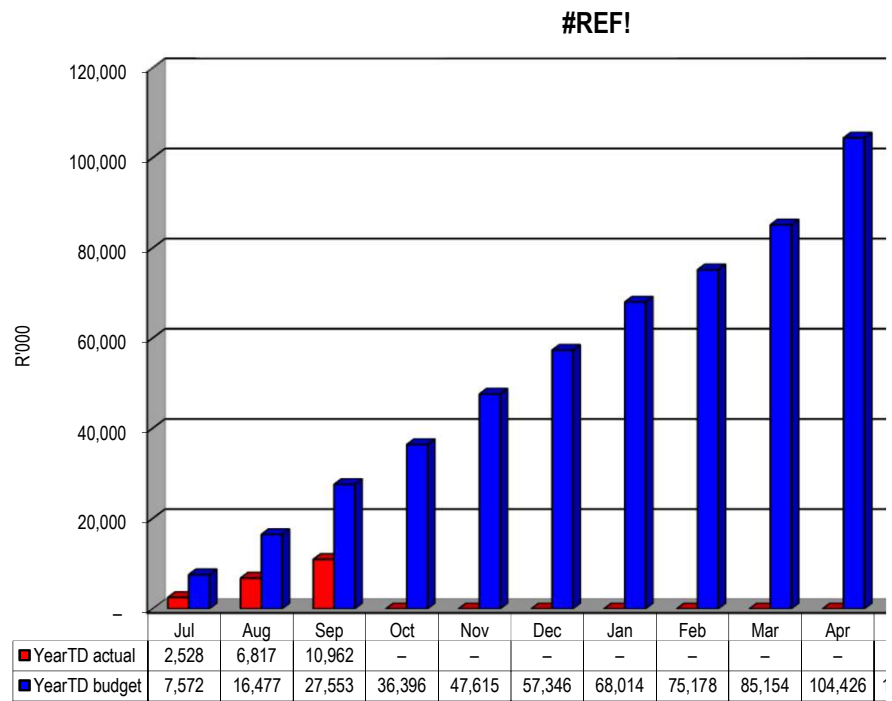
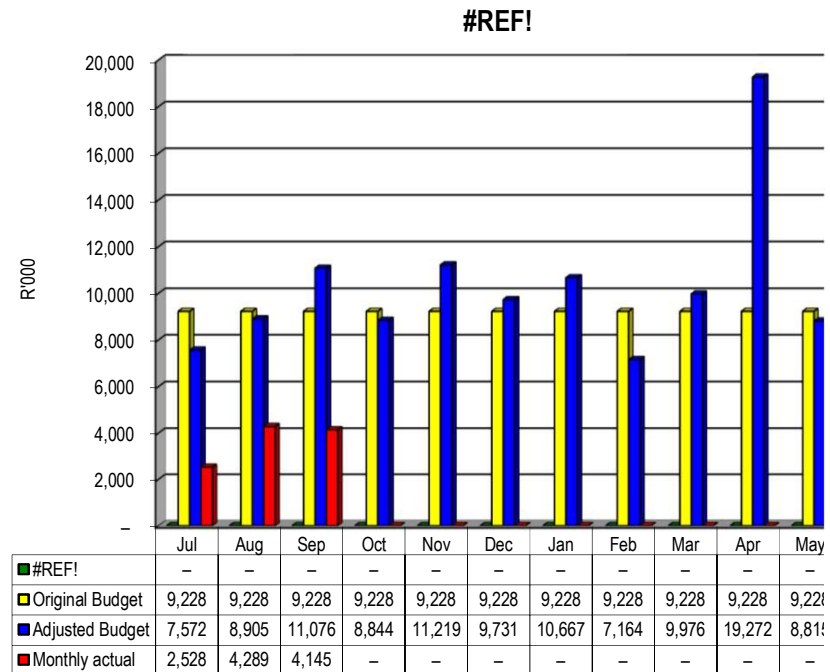


Chart C3 Aged Consumer Debtors Analysis



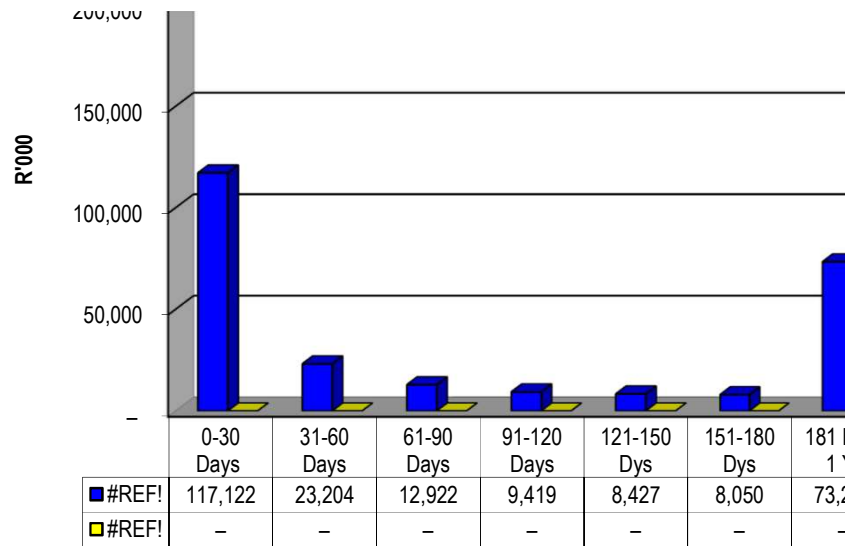


Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (total by Debtor Customer Categor

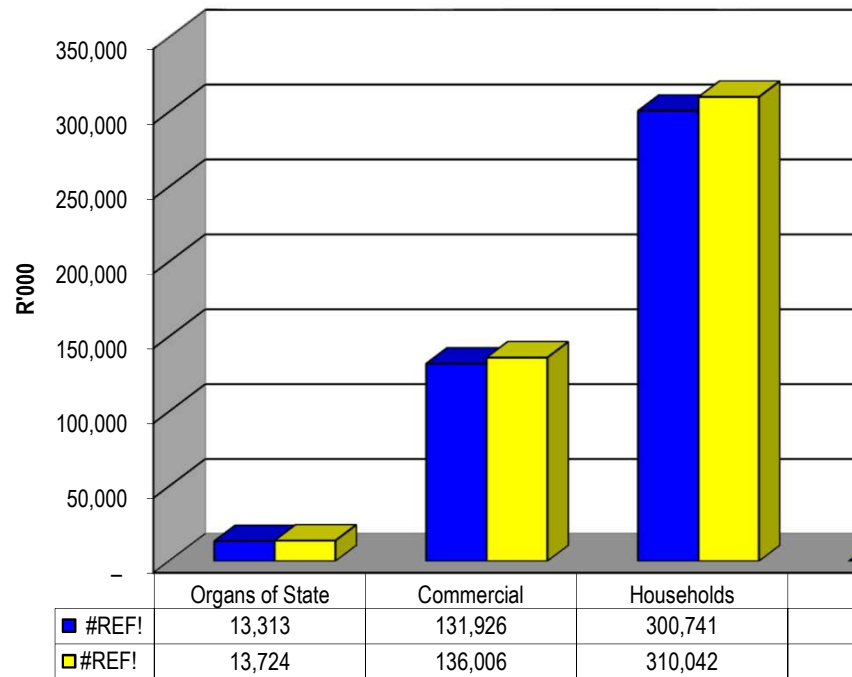
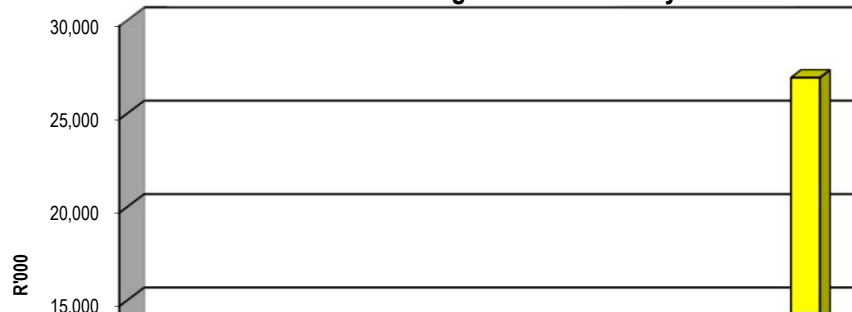
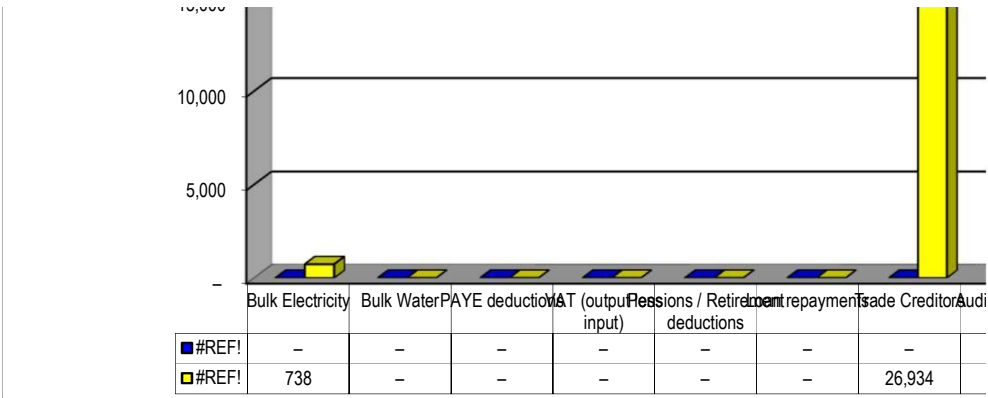
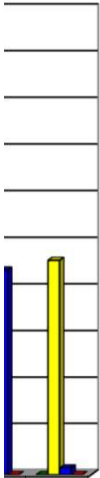


Chart C5 Aged Creditors Analysis

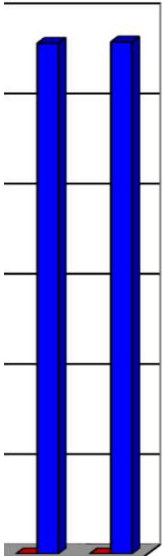
